

Headlice

We have received information from the Public Health Agency regarding a head lice treatment that has caused a child serious burns. This was because the product can be dangerous when exposed to a source of ignition. In the case of this child the source of ignition was a hairdryer which was used after the treatment had been applied. The product is Hedrin 4% Cutaneous Solution and it does carry warnings on the outer packaging about the dangers associated with heat sources.

Head lice in Schools

From time to time all schools are affected by head lice. In recent weeks we have had some outbreaks reported to us by parents. This is normal, particularly in a school of over 400 children. In order to help us to manage any outbreaks children's hair should be checked regularly and any incidents reported to us. This helps us to take action including contacting parents of the children in a particular class if we feel this is required. This is usually done by sending home an advice leaflet. On occasion when we are the ones who discover that the problem exists with a particular child we will also contact the parents to inform them. However, we rely mainly on parents letting us know as they will usually be the first to discover the problem. Thanks to everyone in advance for their co-operation with this issue.
