Weekly Bulletin – Friday 19th January 2018

School Closures – Adverse Weather Conditions

As you will be aware we had to close on Wednesday due to the snow. It is always a difficult decision to close the school at any time and one that must be taken following careful consideration of all the factors involved. This includes consideration of the safety of children, parents & staff in relation to travelling to the school and health & safety issues with the condition of the school site itself. School closures occur in one of two ways. Either we are instructed to close by DENI (as during the recent storms) when we closed for 2 days or we make the decision to close ourselves. When making the decision ourselves we consider the following main factors:

• Is the school site safe enough to bring 400+ children and accompanying adults on to?

Will enough staff be able to get to work to ensure appropriate supervision for the pupils? We also try to take the decision in good time as we appreciate that everyone involved needs to make arrangements. Sometimes this means announcing a closure the day before it is due and at other times it means waiting until the day of the possible closure as was the case this week. In making our decision this week we came on site at 6.30am to assess the situation and once we considered all of the factors we began the process of closing the school, informing everyone by approximately 7.15am. While we appreciate a "same day" closure can cause problems this is due to the fact that our 1st option for consideration is always keeping the school open if possible. We would suggest that parents, as no doubt many of you did, make provisional arrangements for childcare etc. during periods of poor weather that can be brought into operation at short notice. We would also like to remind you that the only way you will hear about St. Brigid's closures will be through our official text messaging service and through the BBC website. We do not communicate these decisions via social media though we do welcome parents sharing information in this way once we have made a text/ BBC announcement. We do know that another St. Brigid's was listed on one facebook page on Tuesday evening as being closed the next day and this caused confusion as this school's address was not included in the posting. Hopefully the above helps parents understand the procedures currently in place. We would be pleased to hear from you if you have any suggestions as to how we could improve the notification service and we thank you for your support going forward.

Incredible Years (Primary 1-3 Parents)

The Incredible Years programme is an excellent programme that we organise each year in partnership with Ballykeel PS. It is designed to support parents with their children's development at home and covers areas such as setting boundaries on behaviour, supporting children's learning, strengthening children's emotional health and social skills and setting rules, routines and limits at home etc. The feedback from participants in recent years has been excellent and we would encourage parents to take up the places that are available as they are limited. The programme lasts for 6 sessions and all are delivered in Ballykeel PS by trained staff. Exact dates and times are not available just yet but sessions take place in the morning (usually 9.15am-11.15am) during February- March and crèche facilities are provided for parents attending. Transport can also be provided for parents attending and everything is funded so there is no cost to attend. If you are interested, please contact Mrs. Brady asap. Parents who have previously completed the programme are welcome to attend again.
